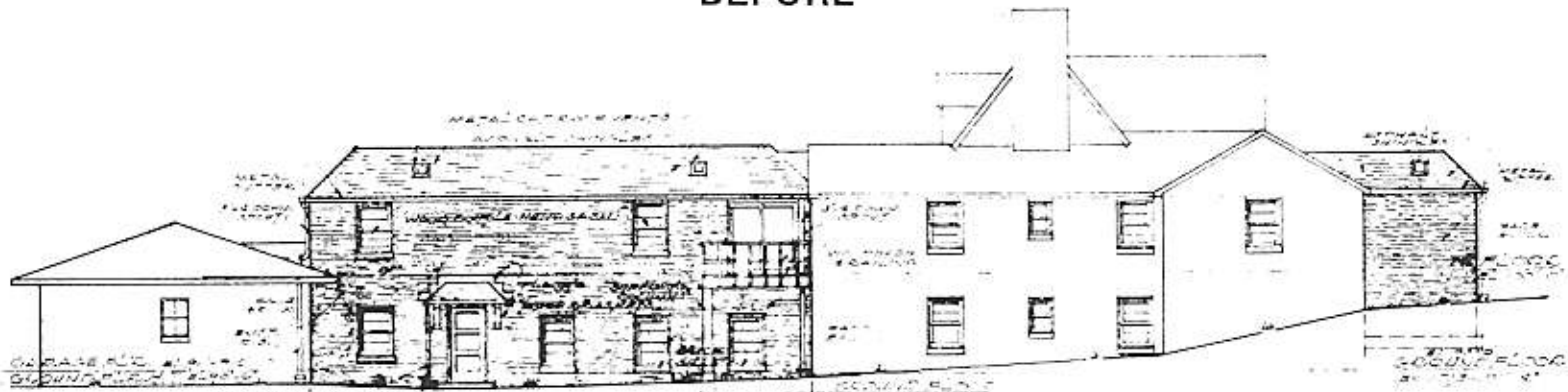

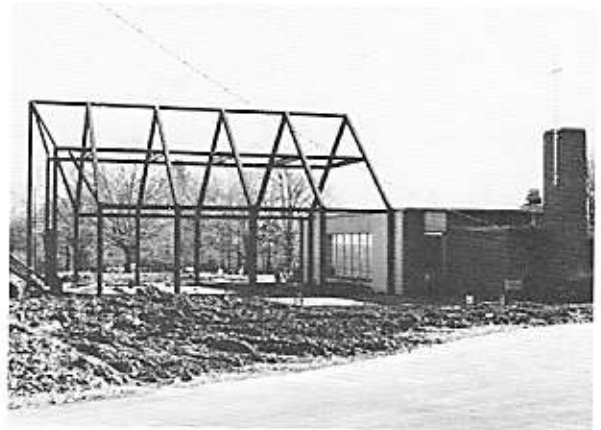
Church begins addition

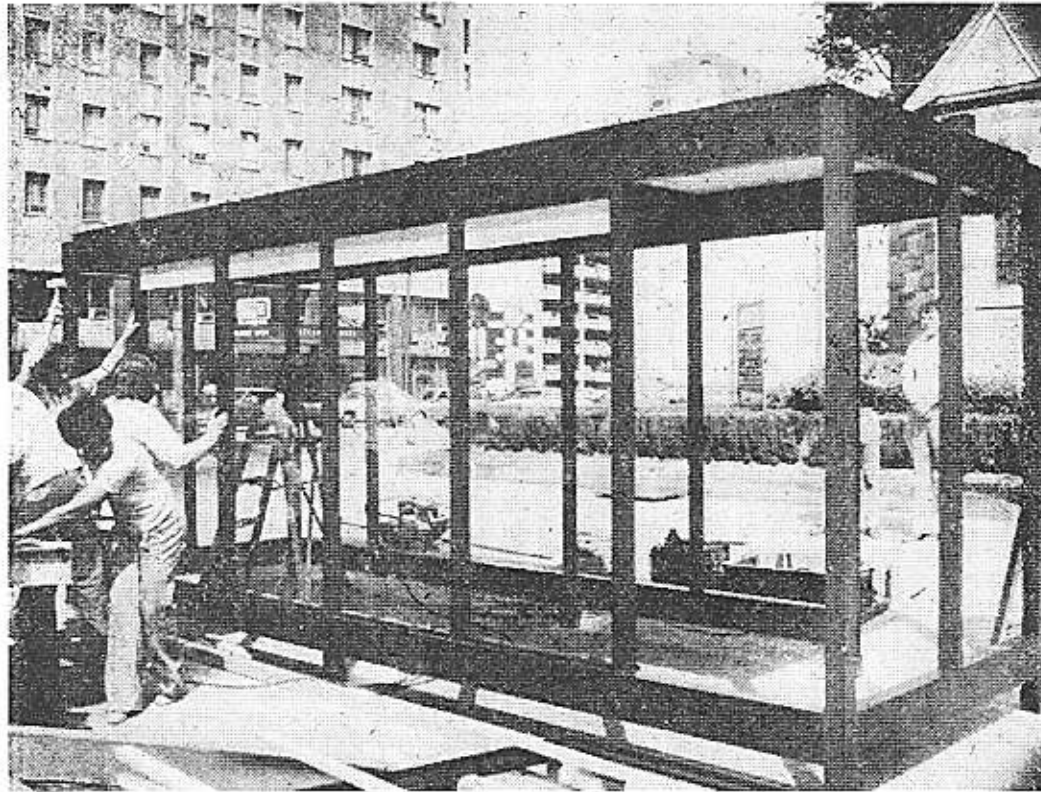

RTA to reconsider bus shelter contract

RTA's first glass-walled bus shelter was installed yesterday near St. John Cathedral downtown.

The Regional Transit Authority agreed yesterday to reconsider a \$1 million contract to install 500 bus shelters because another contractor has more black employees.

Board members William B. Norris and Charles V. Carr moved yesterday to reconsider, saying unemployment is high in Greater Cleveland among minorities. The pair was joined by Harry Alexander, George L. Blaha, Richard S. Stoddart and Frederick Lynch Jr.

RTA officials are expected to consider rescinding the contract June 20 after asking federal mass transit officials if RTA must award the bid to the lowest bidder.

RTA hired Progressive Building Inc., low bidder among five seeking the contract.

Norris and Carr said yesterday they want to switch the contract to Bolinger Construction Co. because it has 10 minority employees. Progressive has no minority workers, but plans to meet equal employment requirements by subcontracting part of the work.

Progressive's bid was \$928,000 while Bolinger's was \$936,000.

The six trustees voted to reconsider the contract only two weeks after the board refused to rescind a controversial multimillion-dollar contract to sell advertising on 300 of the shelters. Trustees said then they feared being sued by the firm to which they had given the contract and that they were not legally required to seek bids for the ad contract.

Meanwhile, the first shelter was installed yesterday on the north side of Superior Ave., east of E. 9th St. by Midwest American Shelter Systems Inc.

Three of the glass-walled shelters will be installed as a demonstration by the manufacturer.

No advertising will be placed on the demonstration shelters.
