Suspicious Fire Hits Garfield Mall

Last Thursday, October 6th, at approximately 1:45 p.m., a fire broke out at Petries in Garfield Mall causing an estimated \$15,000 to the building; there has not been an estimate on the contents which was damaged at this time.

The fire, called "suspicious" by fire inspector Tony Collova, started at a rack of clothing in the front of the store. Only the manager and assistant manager were in the store at the time. The manager saw smoke and then went to investigate, finding a fire started under a rack of clothing in the front. They attempted to put out the flames with a fire extinguisher, called for help and called the

fire fighters. Other mall employees tried in vain to put out the fire with fire extinguishers; Tony Merka, of Merka's Jewelers in Garf. Mall got everyone out of the store and closed the door behind him, containing the fire to Petries. Collova said if this wasn't done "the entire mall might have caught fire."

The entire store had heavy heat and smoke damage, but most of the damage was in the front where the fire started. Fire fighters picked up some evidence and sent it to the analysis lab for study.

Petries is located in Garfield Mall, at 12658 Rockside Road.

I'm writing a "Thank You" note covering the speed and quality of construction work your company did for Vernitron Piezoelectric Division following the May 20, 1983 tornado.

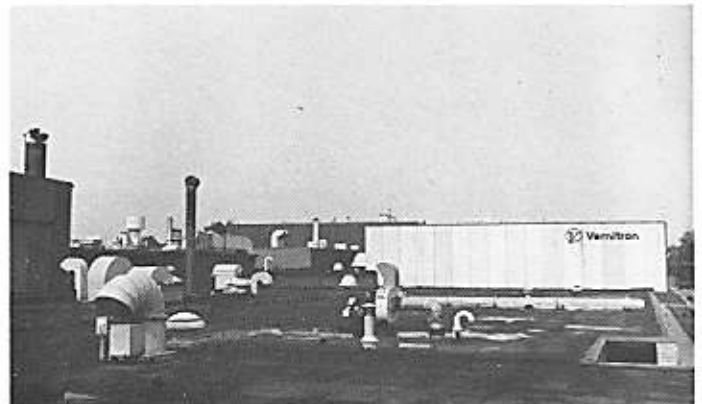

I will certainly recommend your company to anyone looking for prompt service, quality and reliability.

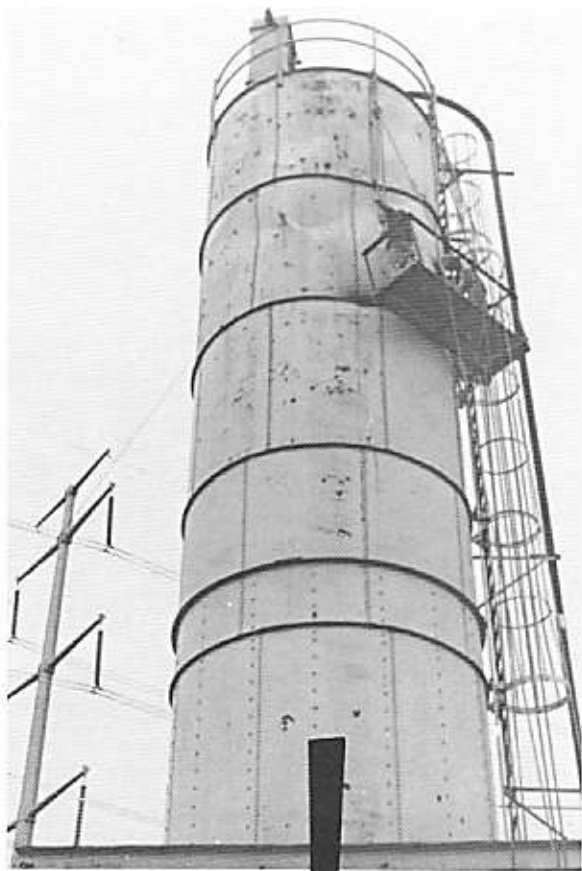

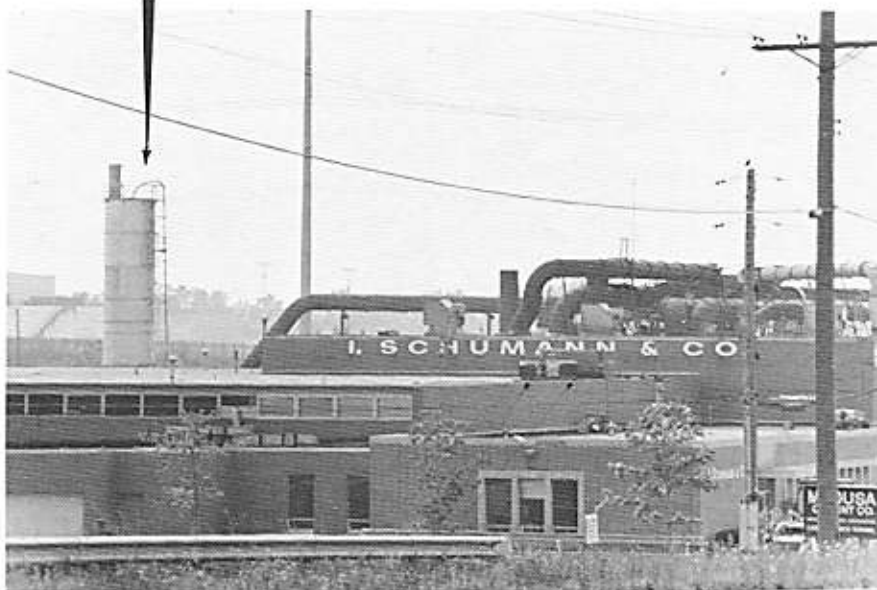
